## May Mission of the Month: The Greater Dover-New Philadelphia Food Pantry

Food assistance is an essential ministry to our community. In addition to providing good food for those who were not sure they had money for their next meal, it is a key support for families under stress, who have had catastrophic events, or are at risk for any number of other difficulties.

The Greater Dover New Philadelphia Food Pantry distributes Thursday evening, 5-8, and Friday morning 9am-Noon. They turn no one away, always can use another volunteer, and is one of the best food pantries in the nation.

## These are the highlights from the 2023 annual report from the food pantry:

Highest ever average number of households receiving food per week – 738, up from 561 in 2022.

In the latter half of 2023, the number was over 800 households per week.

There were 4352 different households served in 2023, 1/3 had children, 1/5 included seniors.

Average cost per week for food \$1528. Average pounds of food per household: 57.2

Average number of times a household visited the pantry in 2023 - 8.4 out of a possible 104 opportunities. (People come when they have a need)

Donations in 2023 - \$158,271 (28% from churches, 45% Businesses, 27% Individuals)

Cash given to the food pantry goes along way. In 2023, they purchased 2,334,188 pounds of food from the Akron-Canton Foodbank, a retail value of \$2,747,490, for only \$78,757.

(as an example, they purchased 144,296 pounds of meat/fish poultry for \$22,153)

## "Peter's Greeting"

**Luke 5:8** "But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees saying, depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord."

John 21:7 "That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea."

Both of these scenes take place on Peter's boat, and both come after Jesus has instructed them to cast their nets one more time, and the result was a massive catch of fish. The difference is that in Luke chapter 5, this is perhaps Peter's first encounter with Christ. In John 21, we have the last recorded encounter between Peter and the Lord, taking place after the cross and the resurrection. Peter gives a very different response the second time!

We may well wonder at Peter warning the Lord against having himself near, saying he 'is a sinful man.' You would be surprised if you knocked on a neighbor's door, and they opened it and said, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man!"

Peter has good reason to know his own sinfulness. He may have been slow to pay attention to the teacher, he argued with Jesus about trying for one more catch. He may have realized that he was more excited about a bonanza catch of fish than about having a true prophet on board his boat. He very well might have been convicted by the sermon Jesus preached. Whatever the reason, he feels unworthy to be in Jesus' presence. He feels it necessary to warn the Lord away. What good could it do Jesus to be associated with the likes of Peter?

But the second time, Peter does not, when he recognizes Jesus on the shore, stand, wave his arms, and say, "Depart from me . . ." Peter now has a heart of love for Christ. He would still admit that he is a sinful person, but he knows the forgiving heart of Jesus. More than that, he cannot wait to be near Him. The boat will be too slow. He must swim ahead.

Jesus will send His Spirit to you so that your heart is more and more in love with him. You must see yourself in Peter's place, longing to greet him first, excited to see His face.

Lastly, I want you to think of the resurrected body that God will give you, His beloved. Many of us do not run anymore, we could not swim quickly or far. But one day, even the wheelchair bound and the bedfast, will run to the arms of Christ. That picture gives me hope.




#### **Choir Notes**

## Your Witness: Your Opportunity" - by Don Gibson

"There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit." Romans 8:1.

Imagine the benefits of exploring other Scriptures to develop the full meaning of walking after the Spirit—through group discussion. What questions might surface? How does this verse compare with Ephesians 2:10, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them." Experience the lesson worksheets, book or video for the lesson points. What margin note does your Bible have that mine doesn't? How does one class member's comment add a different dimension to your question or comment? That interchange is the group discussion Sunday School offers. That's how we learn and grow together in Broadway's adult Sunday School classes.

Are there other benefits? Absolutely. We get to know each other. We befriend each other and strengthen our friendships. We value each other. Now and then we extend the lesson discussion with another as we leave the class. Or it comes up in the Tuesday morning men's group two days later. What else? On many Sundays a class member says, "That connects with Pastor Harley's sermon this morning." If you're in a class, you get it. If you're not, this is an invitation to come learn and grow in Christ—together. And most of all, we fulfill Galatians 3:28 "...for ye are all one in Christ Jesus." By the way, on that Scripture, what is the difference between saying "Jesus Christ" and "Christ Jesus"? We look at that, too.

**There's more**. As brothers and sisters in Christ, we pray for each others' prayer items. What praise does someone have to share? Who's hurting? Who is facing surgery? Who's niece is facing life trauma? Group prayer in class is different from other prayer. It draws us to God as one. It draws out God's grace in us, as mentioned in 2 Corinthians 9:14.

So, part of church life is associating with friends and fellow-Bible students in worship, fellowship and learning opportunities. Broadway offers that. Sunday School is special. Currently, Broadway offers two adult Sunday School classes. (1) The Friendship/Golden Rule class meets in Spencer Hall. Rotating teachers are Pastor Harley, Lotus McCleery, Cecily Fincher, and Cindy McComb. (2) The Pairs & Spares class meets upstairs above Spencer Hall, with teacher Don Gibson and sub-teachers Dale Fincher and John Maurer. Thanks for making Sunday School what it is. If you've yet to try it, pray God leads you to come witness it—better yet, to join us. The saying, "You've gotta be there to get it" counts.


